He currently serves as the Program Coordinator for the Margaret Hashinger Residence Center for the Creative Arts, a KU residence hall that emphasizes the arts. Harry's directing credits include Holiday and The Skin Of Our Teeth at KU, Anything Goes and Grease at Lyric Theatre of Oklahoma, The Glass Menagerie and The Odd Couple at TCU, and Godspell for the Helen

Hocker Center for the Performing Arts in Topeka. He has co-written, with Lyle Dye, Jr., two original musical revues, "Hits From Misses" and "An American Rhapsody" which have been professionally produced. *Annie* is Harry's first production with Theatre in the Park.
