BARBARA NICHOLS (Director) "Oklahoma!" marks Barbara's directing debut at the Park, but her third season of involvement. She has performed in "How to Succeed . . . ," "Broadway, the Ultimate," and "South Pacific." She has directed "The Fourposter" at Marymount College and assistant directed and performed in "Lou Ann Hampton" at the Olathe Community Theater.

STEVEN SMITH (Conductor) With "Oklahoma!," Steven is conducting his sixth production at Theatre in the Park, having previously led the orchestras for "1776," "Annie," "South Pacific," "Anything Goes," and "Man of La Mancha." Steven holds a master's degree in conducting from Northwestern University, and he teaches strings at the Kansas City Middle School of the Arts. Steven is the conductor of the Olathe Community Orchestra and the Overland Park Chamber Orchestra. He recently founded the K.C. Salon Orchestra.

TIM BAIR (Choreographer) "Oklahoma!" marks Tim's fifth season at Shawnee Mission Theatre in the Park. Tim appeared as Paul in last year's award-winning Park production of "A Chorus Line." He previously appeared in Park productions of "Applause" and "A Funny Thing Happened..." and was nominated for a Kansas City Theater award for Best Choreography for his work on "Seven Brides . . ." He is currently appearing at Worlds of Fun in the Tivoli Music Hall production of "Shine."

BRAD ZIMMERMAN (Vocal Director) "Oklahoma!" marks Brad's seventh season with Theatre in the Park. He was seen onstage in

"Camelot," "The Music Man," "Hello, Dolly!" and "Li'l Abner." He served as Vocal Director for "Seven Brides..." and "South Pacific." Brad teaches vocal music in the Olathe School District and is a tenor soloist for the Grace and Holy Trinity Cathedral.

He was the Assistant Director for "Seven Brides..." and was the Stage Manager last summer for "South Pacific." When not at the Park, Lynn is a Programmer Analyst for United Telecom.

ILE HAGGINS (Stage Manager) Ile is making her Park debut, but she is no stranger to the theatrical world, having stage managed as well as directed many productions in her home state of Ohio. Ile is the coordinator of the Images Program, which is designed to help prevent drug abuse by involving high-risk children in the Arts. Ms. Haggins certainly exemplifies the kind of attitude and background for which Theatre in the Park is continuously striving.

JANIS PILCHER (Rehearsal Pianist) This is Janis's third season at the Park, previously accompanying for "How to Succeed ...", "Anything Goes," and playing the accordion for "Seven Brides ...". She played for the Park's first four seasons at Antioch Park. She has her BME from Emporia State University, and currently has a keyboard studio in Shawnee.

JEFF AELING (Scenic Designer/Tech Director) Designing sets is nothing new for Jeff. He has worked in this field for many years for Kenmark Studios. He is a graduate of the Art Institute and does freelance illustrating and painting for The Kansas City Star/Times. He has also just completed the scenic design and construction for a national television commercial. Jeff lives in Kansas City with his wife, Anne, and their dog, Timmy.

PHILIP KINEN (Assistant Producer) This is Philip's third year as Assistant Producer at Theatre in the Park. During the School year he is the Speech and Drama instructor for Pioneer Trail Junior High in Olathe.

YVONNE WALKER (Chorus) Yvonne is a choral director in the Hickman Mills School District, where she is also the founder and director of the Hickman Mills District Faculty Chorale. She has sung with the Kansas City Civic Chorus for four years, and teaches private voice lessons at the Academy of Performing Arts in Grandview, Missouri.

FORREST WHITE (Mr. Carnes) Forrest (better known as Frosty) is appearing in his seventh production at Theatre in the Park. He appeared earlier this summer as Potiphar in "Joseph..." Frosty also played the Professor in "South Pacific," Charlemagne in "Pippin," and Rudolph in "Hello, Dolly!"
