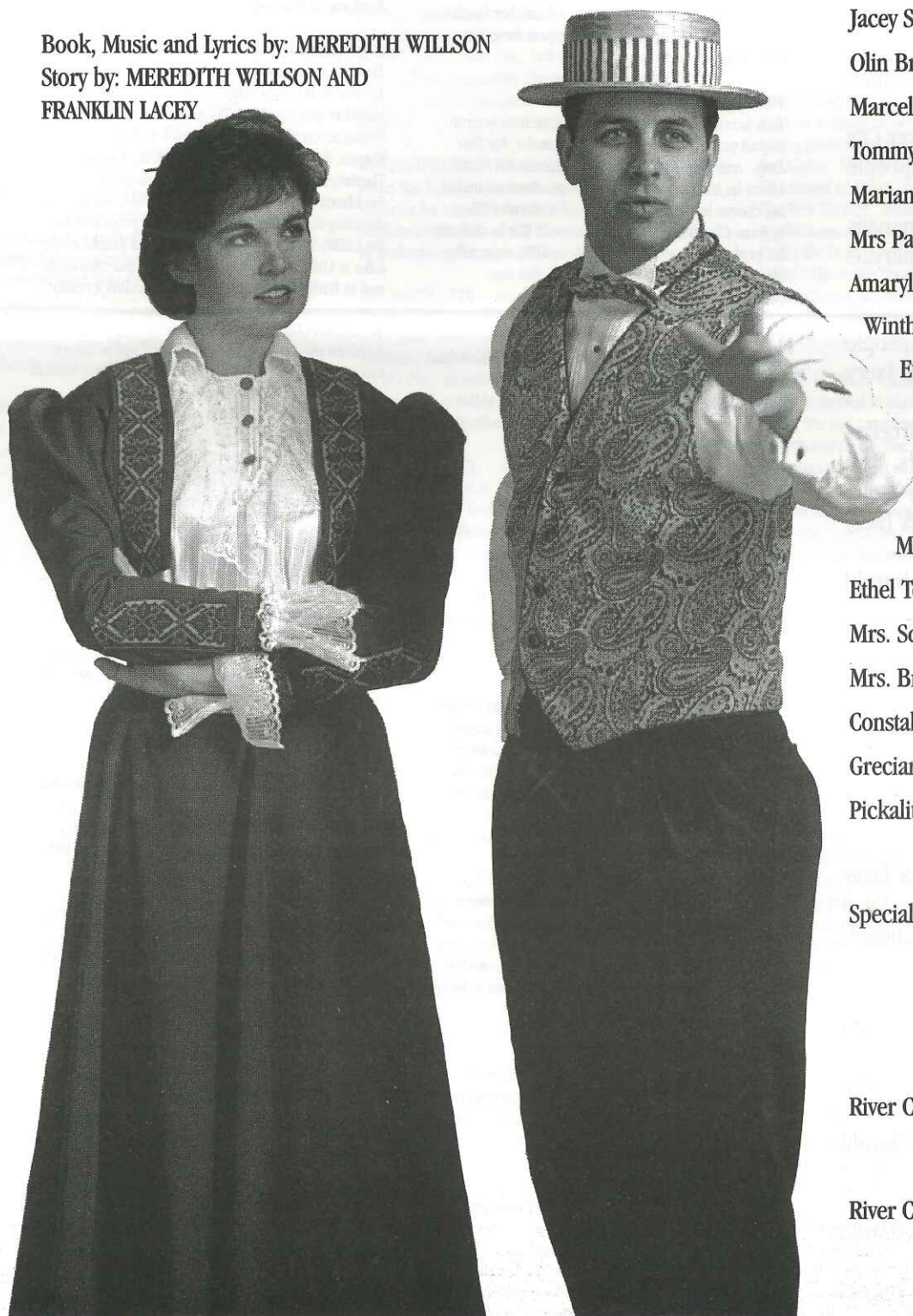

Over forty years ago the magic began when Meredith Willson set pen to paper and wrote the lyrics, music and the book for *The Music Man*. Willson's first musical won the hearts of millions and was honored with numerous awards. It continues to be one of the most frequently produced musicals in the United States.

One of my fondest childhood memories was watching Robert Preston as Professor Harold Hill use his skills of make-believe to transform River City's population from ordinary to extraordinary. As a child, I did that every day! It was my most frequently used muscle - my imagination. As grown-ups we tend to give it different names - "the power of suggestion" or "creativity." Some unfortunately forget they have it and let the muscle atrophy and soften.

The Music Man is a magical tale that reminds us how rich life can be if we allow ourselves to combine reality with the world of imagination. If it works for stubborn Iowans, it can work for anyone!
